In the midst of this crisis GHM is accompanying our partners in concrete ways:

- Small grants and shipments of personal protective equipment (PPE). So far in 2020, we've distributed N95 Masks (27,400), other masks (20,860), gloves (232,705), plus many gowns, face shields and other PPE.
- Funds to help Community Health Workers share simple supplies and education to help slow the spread of the virus.
- Partnering with other agencies to encourage and support locally produced masks and other PPE related supplies.
- Sharing regular, emailed updates of trusted research, good information and practical advice with a large network of our international partners.

The future will certainly hold new challenges. Without the privilege of sheltering in place our partners may indeed face a surge in cases and a large death toll. We will accompany them through it all. But their context (and ours) is changing. Together we will stay attentive and responsive to help the hands that heal. We invite your prayers and participation as our call from God draws us forward to serve with open eyes, open hearts and open hands.

Dr. Paul Kisanga, who directs one of the leading hospitals in Tanzania (Arusha Lutheran Medical Center), wrote GHM just this week:

"[There are] costs that were never anticipated and yet we are now realizing we cannot run away from them...Our vision and mission of providing compassionate care in the region has never been put to test like this ever before. We take consolation trusting in the Lord that He will give the way through friends and supporters like you and others that He will touch. Once again thank you friends."

WE DO THE SAME FOR YOU

A recent email from Dr. Sahondra, Director of SALFA, the Lutheran healthcare system in Madagascar, closed with these words: Thank you for keeping us in your prayers. We do the same for you. Although we may be experiencing the pandemic differently, health workers around the world share the need for masks and gloves to protect themselves and the people around them. We all benefit from frequent hand-washing, but how do you wash your hands well without soap? With support from GHM in partnership with the ELCA and the Norwegian Mission Society, teams from SALFA are delivering a customized mix of masks, gloves, soap, nutritional supplements, hand sanitizer, disinfectant, and more to all 50 SALFA health centers and to 18 toby's (healing camps) across the island. Ankaramalaza Rural Health Clinic received their delivery, like most things, by boat.

WASTE TO REVENUE

An astonishing array of medical supplies are donated to GHM by individuals, hospitals and clinics across the U.S. Some of the items we receive cannot be used by our partners. They may not have the technology or even the power to run the equipment, or the supplies come to us "short-dated," meaning they'll expire before they can arrive overseas. In 2016 we began to turn these "waste" items into revenue. Each year since, more than \$100,000 has been raised through this program for GHM. WestCMR is one of several companies that buy and re-sell supplies our partners can't use. Elise, Manager, Strategic Accounts, says they "appreciate the work that GHM does for those around the world." FRONT LINE FOCUS

Waste. This is the term for preventable disease and injury. Waste of human potential, quality of life, medical and productive resources. *Healthcare* is waste – if the need for it could have been prevented. Partnering to prevent disease and promote health is a primary focus of GHM's consulting arm, GHAP. It is also the best return on your investment to improve health.

Community-based primary health-care (CBPHC) is the broad term for this focus on addressing disease closer to its root. Nearly all current GHAP projects involve some type of CBPHC. Sometimes partners express that they "want a hospital." Coronavirus has reinforced our understanding that access to clinical care is a matter of justice, and essential. But deep listening and dialogue about true needs typically results in mutual

recognition that it is wisest to invest in stronger CBPHC.

In front line struggles against infectious disease like COVID-19, and against many other preventable diseases, GHAP is accompanying partners in Tanzania, Madagascar, South Sudan, and Nigeria, to strengthen CBPHC. One more way GHM is living into our values of good stewardship, reducing waste, and managing resources well.
