## Mwanaidi S. Mshighwa, Vudee Dispensary, Tanzania

Mwanaidi Mshighwa, Medical Attendant, **Vudee Dispensary**, Tanzania, writes that "the early morning of July 12th, 2022, the day I cannot forget. It was a bad shocking day to me and the Vudee Dispensary Staff when a delegation ... from the Ministry of Health closed down the Vudee Dispensary." Even as it closed there were patients in the wards that had to go home unattended. Many were afraid it was the end of the dispensary but, Mwanaidi says, "God acts differently. Global Health Ministries came fast like an American Fighter Jet, which came to rescue us!" A grant from GHM empowered renovation of the dispensary, allowing it to reopen and serve surrounding communities with a better facility, adequate medical supplies and medicines. Mwanaidi describes the closure of the dispensary as a big setback, not only for herself as she faced loss of her job, but for the Vudee Ward residents because the dispensary was their "nearby service provider." The turnaround is "a huge miracle!"

In addition to occasional grants, GHM shipping containers send medical supplies and equipment to small dispensaries and health outposts like Vudee, helping them remain viable and equipping them for their life-giving work.
